Williams, County Executive, provided an overview of State and Federal budget developments and noted that the State Legislature passed its version of the budget by the June 15, 20205 deadline. He further reported that the proposal retains Medi-Cal cuts, including freezing enrollment in Medi-Cal and imposing \$30 monthly premiums that could reduce coverage and increase administrative costs. Mr. Williams further expressed concern regarding the U.S. Senate budget proposal that would reduce Medicaid funding through caps on provider taxes and State-directed payments that significantly impact County health systems. Finally, he provided information relating to the Stars and Strides Run, the rising census at Regional Medical Center, and the upcoming Take Our Kids to Work Day events, and recognized Pride Month and the Juneteenth Federal holiday.
